The first Adventure everyone starts with in Cub Scouting is Bobcat. Bobcat is focused on character and introducing the values of Scouting to you and your Cub Scout. To learn more about the Bobcat Adventure use the QR code above.

Requirements:

- 1. Get to know the members of your den.
- 2. Have your Lion adult partner or den leader read the Scout Law to you. Demonstrate your understanding of being friendly.
- 3. Share with your Lion adult partner, during a den meeting or at home, a time when you have demonstrated the Cub Scout motto "Do Your Best."
- 4. At home, with your parent or legal guardian do the activities in the booklet "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide."

Lesson Plan:

- 1. Have people put name tags on as they arrive.
- 2. Have each child and adult partner review the Scout Law in the handbook until everyone shows up (or about 10 minutes).
- 3. Lions Talk and Lions listen activity (in handbook)
- 4. Create Friendship zipper pulls (supplies provided)
- 5. Sing Wigalo song
- 6. Create Den Doodles (supplies provided)
- 7. Remind everyone to go over the Youth Protection Pamphlet activities at home!!



Adventure: I'll Do It Myself

Learn about personal responsibility.

## Requirements:

- 1. Make and use a "lion bag" for personal Scouting gear.
- 2. Construct a personal care checklist
- 3. Put on your shoes without help. Take them off and put them away.

- 1. Have people put name tags on as they arrive.
- 2. Play "Are those my shoes?" While waiting for everyone and once or twice once everyone arrives. Talk about how some places in the world do not wear shoes indoors.
- 3. Have each child and adult partner review handbook pages 43 and 45. Make checklists using crayons and pages 43/45 in the handbook.
- 4. Make a Lion Bag using bags from Scout Shop, Permanent Markers, Fabric paint.
- 5. Remind everyone to review the Youth Protection Pamphlet or review it online if they have not already.
- 6. Talk about the next meeting, what is the date, what is needed.



Adventure: Mountain Lion – (Outdoors) (Required)

The natural environment continues to be a great place to learn and discover. The value of being outdoors has been proven to have benefits for both youth and adults. For Lion Cub Scouts, this means simply taking a walk outside and noting what they see.

Requirements:

- 1. Identify the Cub Scout Six Essentials. Show what you do with each item
- 2. With your den, pack, or family, take a walk outside spending at least 20 minutes exploring the outdoors with your Cub Scout Six Essentials. While outside, identify things that you see with your Lion adult partner that are natural and things that are man made.
- 3. Describe what S.A.W. means
- 4. Identify common animals that are found where you live. Separate those animals into domesticated and wild

- 1. Have people put name tags on as they arrive. (Optional)
- 2. Have each child and adult partner work on Domestic or Wild animals on page 12 (in handbook). Share with the group once everyone arrives.
- 3. Review what S.A.W. means. Use page 11 (in handbook).
- 4. Play Kim's game with Cub Scout Six Essentials.
- 5. Go for a HIKE/WALK!! Make sure it's at least 20 minutes. Play reverse hide and seek or let kids practice blowing whistles.
- 6. Remind everyone to go over the Youth Protection Pamphlet activities at home!!



Adventure: Lets' Camp

Learn about the basics of camping on this overnight Adventure.

Requirements:

- 1. Learn about the buddy system and how it works in the outdoors.
- 2. Before going on the overnight campout, discuss what type of weather is expected and what type of clothes you should wear.
- 3. Pack up your Cub Scout Six Essentials for the campout.
- 4. Attend a council or district Cub Scout overnight camp or attend a campout with your pack.

- 1. As Scouts come in, have them "Buddy up" and play Tic Tac Toe. Use plain paper and crayons.
- 2. Once everyone arrives, discuss how the Buddy System works. Complete page 47 (in handbook).
- 3. Do the "What should Kat wear" activity (in handbook).
- 4. Remind everyone when and where camping is taking place. Remind Scouts to bring 6 essentials.
- 5. Talk about the next meeting and what is needed.



Adventure: Fun on the Run – (Personal Fitness) (Required)

Personal fitness is learning about proper nutrition, hygiene, exercise, and rest Children who develop habits at an early age are more likely to continue those habits into adulthood

#### **Requirements:**

- 1. Identify the five different food groups.
- 2. Practice hand washing, point out when you should wash your hands.
- 3. Be active for 20 minutes.
- 4. Practice methods that help you rest.

#### Lesson Plan:

- 1. Have Scouts sign up to bring different snack items for this meeting to share.
- 2. Have Scouts go outside and play with bubbles and freeze tag for 20 minutes. Ask how their hands feel.
- 3. Come inside and practice washing hands.
- 4. Eat snacks while doing page 13 (in handbook). Talk about or show different food groups.
- 5. Try a quick meditation or breathing practice.
- 6. Remind everyone about next meeting and what is needed.

- 1 . Explain that choices have consequences.
- 2. Perform a Good Turn for another person.

- Have Scouts play Tic Tac Toe with a buddy as they show up. Use pages 57 & 59 (in handbook). Once everyone has played, have them talk about how choices lead to consequences.
- 2. Have Scouts pick a new buddy. Practice compliments.
- 3. Have Scouts pick a chore they will help with at home.
- 4. Learn and play "Rock, Paper, Scissors".
- 5. Remind everyone about the next meeting and what is needed.
